## OVERVIEW

The involvement of psychiatrists in the diagnosis and treatment of HIV/AIDS patients is essential. For over ten years, the APA AIDS Program Office has provided a full range of support services for psychiatrists whose patients have, or are at risk for, HIV infection and AIDS. We offer local, national and residency training programs; curricula and clinical resources; policy guidelines; and referral and support to individual clinicians. Our desire to meet the needs of the provider community is not limited to the resources in this brochure. We are happy to answer your specific requests for mental health information and resources, assist with your training activity, and link you with local experts in HIV care. We work collaboratively with a number of individuals, as well as professional organizations, and welcome such opportunities.

**Training and Educational Programs.** APA staff can coordinate half-day to two day training programs on the neuropsychiatric and psychological dimensions of HIV disease through our network of regional trainers. Trainings are tailored to meet the specific needs of individual audiences at residency training programs, hospitals, medical groups, local health care organizations, and APA's district branches. ### **HIV-Related Neuropsychiatric Complications and Treatments.**
